**From the West:** This year, as in previous, the Grand Master has issued a proclamation declaring the month of April, Public Education Month. Each Lodge within the State is encouraged to participate in some fashion with a local public school.

At our March Stated Meeting we learned that two schools, local to our Lodge, were in need of assistance: the Pasadena Elementary School and Whitney Elementry School. As a result motions were made and passed to assist both schools with donations.

The principles of both schools, and in the case of Pasadena Avenue Elementary the two petitioning teachers, will be attending our Stated Meeting Dinner, prior to our April 16<sup>th</sup> Stated Meeting, for the presentations of our donations.

Pasadena Elementary, according to a letter receieved by the Lodge in early March, was asking the Lodge to support a field trip, planned for May 1<sup>st</sup>, to enable their fourth and fifth grade classes to visit the Academy of Sciences in San Francisco.


This Trip not only meets all of the state science standards, but coincides with the schools focus on the sciences. Pasadena Elementary is on of the first schools in the Sacramento Area to adopt and implement the "Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS)".

Whitney Elementary School is a school is a little different than Pasadena being that it has a large population of immigrants and refugees. The school recieves a large amount of funding from the government for cirriculum based funding. Whitney Elementary's need is based on sporting equipment, in the form of kickballs, basketballs, footballs, etc... The members of Oak Plains made a motion and the motion was passed to help the school buy the necessary sporting equipment to ensure these children have a time to learn to play sports.

Bicentennial Daylight Lodge also supports Whitney Elementary by mentoring children through the "Raising a Reader" program and also helps support them with donnations to their educational programs as well.

Representatives from both schools have been asked to make brief presentations at our Stated Meeting Dinner of April 16<sup>th</sup> as to how these funds will assist their programs. Please plan to attend the dinner and listen to these great local educators and prepared to be inspired.
