The May Temple Board meeting was very busy, and we have several more projects starting in the coming weeks. First, we will be painting the dining room and putting down new flooring. Second, we will be painting the outside of the building. The outside has become worn, faded and could lead to much larger repairs if we do not get the stucco sealed. The security cameras are being installed and should be up and running in a few more weeks. The Master's pictures have been removed from the dining room and will be relocated to the Lodge room in the coming weeks. Also, you will notice many church pews in the dining room now, these are the replacement for the chairs in the lodge room. We will need to have them recovered and cut to fit in the lodge room. We are shooting to have these installed by the end of the summer.

As with all projects timing is always a huge concern. There are many moving parts to this project like planning, blue prints, permits, funding, and Grand Lodge coordination. We are in the very early parts of planning this project. This project may seem like nothing of measurable action is being done. These next processes are done behind the scenes and could take several months. I would not expect much in the way of visible progress for 6-9 months. We will do our best to make sure we do not have an impact on the installation season in the Fall and Winter of 2019. Please stay tuned for more updates.

Take me out to the ball game! The summer is here, and we are playing some baseball! Well the kids are at least! This summer I encourage you think back to those summers of long ago when we were out playing ball with our friends. Maybe you think of your first baseball glove... The smell of the leather and the feel of the brand-new mitt or maybe the countless nights of oiling your new glove and putting a ball in it and sleeping on it to break it in for the upcoming baseball season... ahhh the memories!

Sadly, many kids have a much different experience... They sign up for summer baseball leagues and show up for practice with no glove at all... they use their buddies' mitt; they use their hands; or they must choose a glove that was left at the park or dumped out of a bucket.

This is where we as Masons can make a difference in a child in the most meaningful way. Masons4Mitts is a program that is sponsored by Major League Baseball and Masons of California. Our adopted team is the Junior Giants Little League. The Junior Giants Program is more than little league or baseball or even baseball gloves. The program is also curriculum based where the kids are taught the Four Bases of Character Development – Confidence, Integrity, Leadership and Teamwork as well as the importance of Education, Health and Bullying Prevention. Every year the Junior Giants has over 5,000 coaches, parents and volunteers to help educate and teach over 24,000 kids all over California. There are over 90 Leagues serving 370 cities.

Sacramento plays a huge roll in the success of Masons4Mitts we have Junior Giants Teams from Mt. Shasta to Lodi; from Woodland to Auburn; West Sacramento to Citrus Heights; Redding to Oroville and many other cities in the region.

Why am I talking about it in the Oak Plains Trestle Board? We are all Masons and it is an opportunity to help our youth by making an \$20 donation to buy one mitt for one child. To help give them that first glove that is their very own. So far in California, as of May 25, 2019, California Masons have given over 1,150 mitts. Sadly, Sacramento has only donated 29 of those gloves. Let's make a difference in our Oak Plains Lodge and donate a glove.
