From the West: As we discussed in my last month's submittal, this year as in years previous, the Grand Master has issued a proclamation declaring the month of April, Public Education Month, Each Lodge within the state was encouraged to participate in some fashion with a public school.

At our March Stated Meeting we learned that two schools, local to our lodge, needed assistance: The Pasadena Avenue School and Whitney Elementary School. As a result, motions were made and passed to assist both schools with donations.

A proposal letter was received from Pasadena Elementary and the two petitioning teachers, along with the School Principle, attended our Stated Meeting Dinner, on April 16th for the presentation of our

donation and explained their program(s). Ms. Lisa Criss and Ms. Karen Jackson (the Fourth and Fifth grade teachers). Along with the School Principal, Ms. Mirna Pelayo, were in attendance and accepted our donation.

Their proposal/request was in support of a field trip, planned for May 1st that would enable their Fourth and Fifth grade classes to visit the Academy of Sciences in San Francisco. Our donation was to assist with transportation and other nuances surrounding the trip.

According to their proposal, this trip not only met all the state science standards but coincides with the schools focus on the sciences. Pasadena Avenue Elementary is one of the first schools in the Sacramento Area to adopt and implement the "Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS)".

Each teacher made a short presentation that not only further explained the intended trip but discussed several additional ways the Lodge could assist the school on a more ongoing basis. (Note: At our stated meeting in March, the Lodge discussed the fact that we should consider additional ways in which we could assist Pasadena Avenue Elementary).

Our speakers for the evening discussed the possibility of our (either a Brother, their lady or other family member) assisting in: after school tutoring; in-class course assistance (depending on the volunteer's expertise); buddy reading; assistance with the construction booths for their Fall 2018 Harvest Festival; art docent; a robotics program (in development); and student preparation in the 2018-2019 Science Olympiad (Pasadena Elementary won this year's event).

I have already received a promise of assistance re the setting up of the booths for the Fall Harvest Festival. Our Senior Deacon, Brother Mauricio Pasos, has volunteered to put his construction talents to work and assist in the construction and or setting up, of said booths. If anyone would be interested in assisting Bro. Mauricio, in this endeavor, please contact me, or contact Bro. Mauricio directly, to make yourselves available. As of yet, I have not received any other volunteers to assist the School with any of their other needs, so please if anyone is interested, or knows of anyone who can assist, contact me at 916-715-6427 or retired830pc@comcast.net. Since it is so far into the current school year, the request for assistance would be for the 2018-2019 school year.
